

RESOLUTION NO. 2024-234

**RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF
THE CITY OF SAN BERNARDINO, CALIFORNIA,
AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE A
3RD AMENDMENT WITH SAN MANUEL BAND OF
MISSION INDIANS FOR POLICE SERVICES.**

WHEREAS, in 2017, the San Manuel Band of Mission Indians and the City of San Bernardino Police Department entered into an agreement for police services under the San Manuel Community Credit Fund Restricted Grant Agreement.

WHEREAS, in 2019 the First Amendment renewed the Agreement until 2021 and included the funding of traffic cameras.

WHEREAS, in 2021 the Memorandum of Agreement (Second Amendment) again renewed the Agreement and funded four full-time fully burdened Police Officers to patrol the identified service areas around the Reservation and the Tribe's commercial properties in San Bernadino.

WHEREAS, the current Memorandum of Agreement expires in January of 2025 and the Tribe is desirous of continuing a policing agreement; however, increasing the personnel dedicated to the service areas.

WHEREAS, the 3rd Amendment will include the Tribe funding six full-time fully burdened Police Officers and one full-time fully burdened Police Sergeant, police cars, police equipment, and police training.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN BERNARDINO AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The above recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein by this reference.

SECTION 2, Mayor and City Council hereby authorize the City Manager to execute a 3rd Amendment to the 2017 San Manuel Community Credit Fund Restricted Grant Agreement entering into a police services agreement until December 31, 2028.

SECTION 3, Authorizing the Interim Director of Finance and Management Services to amend the adopted FY 24/25 budget for the amount of \$2,086,620 in revenues and expenditures.

SECTION 4, Authorizing the Police Department to increase staffing by one (1) Police Sergeant position and two (2) Police Officer positions.

SECTION 5. That the City Council finds this Resolution is not subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) in that the activity is covered by the general rule that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the

environment. Where it can be seen with certainty, as in this case, that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment, the activity is not subject to CEQA..

SECTION 6. Severability. If any provision of this Resolution or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications, and to this end the provisions of this Resolution are declared to be severable.

SECTION 7. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective immediately.
