On behalf of the National Endowment for the Arts and the United States Conference of Mayors, we are delighted to join Boston Mayor Michelle Wu in inviting you to attend the **78th National Session** of the Mayors' Institute on City Design in Boston, MA from October 11-13, 2023. As the host, Mayor Wu is looking forward to your participation.

The <u>Mayors' Institute on City Design (MICD)</u> is the nation's preeminent forum for mayors to address pressing issues through the lens of city design and development. As our cities move forward with a renewed focus on equity, safety, and opportunity for all, this session will provide actionable ideas for city leaders rising to meet this moment of opportunity. Since 1986, the Mayors' Institute has helped transform communities by preparing mayors to be the chief urban designers of their cities. MICD sessions bring together experts in the allied city design fields – architecture, landscape architecture, equitable development, real estate, and more – to help mayors put their ideals into action in the built environment.

Participation is limited to seven mayors, seven design and development experts, and MICD leadership partners. In order to encourage an open dialogue among participants, there will be no media or city staff present during the event. The meeting will begin with a tour of Boston in the afternoon on Wednesday, October 11, followed by the opening reception and dinner. The working sessions that take place over the next two days will conclude in the late afternoon on Friday, October 13, followed by a closing dinner.

If you agree to attend MICD, we will work with you to develop a "case study," that is, a pressing city development challenge in your community that might be explored from the perspective of urban design. The design and development experts will also give presentations on topics carefully chosen to address the case studies that mayors bring to the session. The roundtable discussion that follows each presentation will offer a rare opportunity for you, fellow mayors, and the design experts to discuss these issues candidly and explore solutions that can improve the built environment of your city. Mayors often indicate that they return to their communities with concrete ideas for their case study project, and with substantially increased confidence in their ability to tackle these complex issues and design solutions.
